Entries close and must be postmarked by **Thursday**, **February 1st** for pre-entry discounts. Day of show entries may be available if the trial has not filled. <u>Contact Marie by Wednesday</u>, <u>February 7th for day of show entry information</u>.

ASCA ACE program: Dogs entered in the ACE program (standard division) will jump 4" lower than their standard jump height and receive 10% more time, and will be able to compete for ribbons and titles. Dogs 7 years and older may enter the ACE Sr. Dog Division and jump an additional 4" lower and receive additional SCT. Please refer to the jump height chart below for height 'cut offs'. The 'traditional' ASCA program has been named the Championship program. *Please note either CH or ACE program on your entry form.*

Miscellaneous rules and things you should know:

This trial will be held under the current rules and regulations of ASCA. Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of the rules and regulations of ASCA (Australian Shepherd Club of America) and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial. A copy of ASCA's Agility Rulebook may be downloaded free from the ASCA web site: www.asca.org. An ASCA number is not required for entry, however ASCA requires registration of all non-ASCA registered dogs in order to record and track scores for ASCA titles. A 'QTracking' number can be obtained by submitting a Service Membership/QTracking number application, located on the ASCA website (https://asca.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/06/qtsvcapp.pdf)

No entry shall be accepted from a dog or handler that has been disqualified from the ASCA Agility or ALL ASCA programs. All entrants must be in good standing with ASCA. All dogs must be on leash when not competing in the ring. IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO RUN LOOSE / OFF LEASH when not in the agility ring. Please clean up after yourself and your dog. No entry will be refunded if the trial cannot start or be completed by reason of riot, civil disobedience, fire and act of God, public emergency, and act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. On any given day that the trial would fill with the entries received that day, the entries that were received on that date will be drawn at random. Confirmations, class run order and check-in information will be emailed to all entered. There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date, or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal. Refunds will be issued for bitches that come in season, if notification in writing is received before February 10th. Checks not honored by the bank do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$25 service charge for returned checks. Toys will be allowed in the ring at this trial. They will run at the end of each jump height. All local and state health guidelines will be followed.

<u>Measuring Requirements</u>: Dogs that require measuring will be measured Saturday and Sunday at 7:45 AM. Dogs with a wither height less than or equal to 20", that do not have a permanent ASCA, AKC or NADAC height card must be measured or show jump height card. Please send a copy of your approved jump height card with your entry unless you have submitted your card at previous Tri-County trials.

<u>Camping</u>: Contact Ann McCabe for camping reservations at Diamond Dogs. Overnight camping is available. NO hookups. 'Dry Camping' only. There will be port-a-potties available onsite.

AWARDS: Ribbons for 1st through 4th place in class for each jump height class (dogs jumping 24" will be included with the 20"+ class). Green qualifying ribbons will be offered to every dog obtaining a qualifying score in both Championship and ACE Programs. HIGH IN TRIAL rosettes or awards will be awarded to the Novice, Open and Elite dogs, in the Standard division in Championship Program. An overall HIT rosette or award will be awarded in the Veteran Dog and Junior Handler divisions in Championship Program. The highest point totals will win; ties to be broken by the fastest combined YPS. An Elite Q = 7 HIT points, an Open Q = 6 HIT points, a Novice Q = 5 HIT points. Faulted Q's will be given half the point value. The level the dog is entered in the regular classes will determine the award level for the standard division awards.

<u>DIRECTIONS</u> to Diamond Dogs K9 Events Center: <u>From the South</u>: From the 5 Freeway take the 91 Freeway East to the 71 (Chino Valley Freeway) North. From the 15 freeway take the 91 Freeway West to the 71. Take 71 North to the Peyton / Riverside Drive exit. Turn right on Riverside Drive. Travel East 1/4th mile to Mc Croskey Road. (on the south/right side of the street) Turn right on Mc Croskey Road. Drive to the end / entrance to Diamond Dogs K9 Events Center. If you pass RESERVOIR Ave., you've gone too far.

<u>From the North</u>: Take the 10 Freeway East / 60 Freeway East to the 71 Freeway South. Take 71 South to the Peyton Drive exit. Turn left and drive under the 71 Freeway. Peyton Drive turns into Riverside Drive heading east. Travel east 1/4th mile to Mc Croskey Road (on the South / Right side of the street). Turn right on Mc Croskey Road. Drive to the end / entrance to Diamond Dogs K9 Events Center. If you pass RESERVOIR Ave., you've gone too far.

<u>From the 60 FRWY</u>: Get off at Reservoir and head south. Turn Right on Riverside and a quick left on Mc Croskey. Drive to the end / entrance to Diamond Dogs K9 Events Center.

Note: To return to 71 Frwy North, go west on Riverside. To 71 Frwy South, go west on Riverside to Peyton. Take Peyton South to Chino Ave. onramp. Goods, services, gasoline and food available on Peyton Drive.

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AS USED HERE, "ASCA®" MEANS THE OWNER AND THE OPERATOR OF THE EVENT PREMISES, THE AUSTRALIAN SHEPHERD CLUB OF AMERICA, ITS AFFILIATE CLUBS, AND EACH OF THEIR MEMBERS, OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES, SHOW CHAIRMEN, SHOW COMMITTEES AND AGENTS.

AGREEMENT

IMPORTANT LEGAL AGREEMENT—Please read the following carefully as it, among other things, may prevent you from suing ASCA® and persons/entities affiliated with it. This agreement could even require you to defend them from demands and suits by third parties that include an assertion of wrongdoing by you. (1) The person signing this Agreement represents being authorized to enter into it on behalf of him/herself, as well as (if different) the owner(s)/exhibitor(s)/handler(s) of the dog(s) for which an entry form is being submitted (all these parties collectively referred to herein as "Applicant"). (2) "Releasees" here collectively refers to the Australian Shepherd Club of America® (ASCA®); its affiliate clubs; and the officers and board of directors, staff, contractors, insurers, attorneys, and agents of ASCA® and of those clubs. (3) This Agreement voluntarily is entered into by Applicant in exchange for the acceptance of the associated entry form and permission to participate in related activities. (4) Applicant agrees to abide by the rules and regulations of ASCA® and any other rules and regulations applicable to this event. (5) Applicant certifies that the entered dog will not pose a hazard to people, property, stock animals, or other dogs, and further that the dog is current with rabies shots along with any other vaccinations required by its state of residence. (6) Applicant acknowledges and assumes the risks to Applicant and Applicant's dog associated with participation in the event, among which could be ones associated with poor condition of the facilities and surrounding areas; security measures or lack of them; electrical appliances; fittings; show rings; the presence of unfamiliar persons; and the presence/involvement of other animals—whether stock, dogs, or otherwise. (7) Applicant further agrees to comply with all recommended and required health and safety precautions, among which may be those related to social distancing; quarantining; wearing of face coverings; and non-participation of persons exhibiting symptoms or for whom there otherwise has been a likelihood of recent exposure to COVID-19 or other contagious diseases. (8) Applicant additionally acknowledges and agrees to assume the risks associated with taking part in the event though others might neglect compliance with health and safety precautions/requirements or pose an undue risk of spreading disease. For example, as is true as to any public event, there is some risk that Applicant and/or those affiliated with Applicant may catch COVID-19 or another contagious disease at the event. (9) To the maximum extent permissible, this release is to be interpreted under Texas law, without application of its choice of law rules. (10) To the extent that Applicant—or another party suing on behalf of Applicant, or suing to recover based on injuries/death/damage to Applicant's dog/Applicant's property—sues ASCA® (or a board member or staff member or agent of ASCA®) as a defendant, the sole appropriate forum (to the maximum extent permitted by law) for the suit shall be the state or federal courts serving Brazos County, Texas (where ASCA® has its headquarters). (11) Applicant hereby releases and waives any claims Applicant otherwise might assert against the Releasees as to any injury or damage claim connected in any way to any alleged act or omission arising out of, or occurring concurrent with, the event and related activities, interactions, communications, and even adjacent premises. (12) This release is made not only as to Applicant but also for anyone who might assert a claim on behalf of Applicant or based on purported injury or damage to Applicant/Applicant's dog/Applicant's property, as well as any heir, beneficiary, assignee, executor, trustee, agent, or survivor of Applicant. (13) Applicant further agrees to assume sole responsibility for and indemnify and hold Releasees harmless from related claims, demands, judgments, and settlement payments. (14) These waiver, release, and indemnification provisions extend even to claims or demands asserting that the acts or omissions resulted in bodily injury or death or from intentional wrongdoing, as well as to attorney fees and other costs of defense. (15) The duties of indemnification further extend to any claims or demands asserted against Releasees that are alleged to have arisen out of the acts or omissions of Applicant, Applicant's dog, or others affiliated with Applicant. Among other things, this means that Applicant would pay the legal defense of Releasees if someone sued them based on a claim Applicant carelessly exposed the claimant to COVID-19. (16) Applicant's promises in this agreement apply without regard to the type of claim or cause of action asserted against Releasees. (17) To the extent any provision of this agreement is unenforceable, the remainder of it nonetheless is to be enforced. (18) This agreement is to be interpreted to provide Releasees with the maximum permissible legal protection from—among other things—claims and suits pursued by Applicant (and/or those acting on behalf of Applicant or over injury/damage to Applicant), as well as from ones based on the purported wrongful acts or omissions of Applicant. (19) Nothing in this Agreement requires you to indemnify Releasees from claims by third parties that involve no allegations of improper acts or omissions by you, those affiliated with you, nor your dog(s). (20) Applicant acknowledges having read, understood, and had the opportunity for independent legal review of this document prior to signing it.
